

### The Workers Are Few

Sometimes I select a theme verse for the summer. Words that inspire. Encourage. Uplift. Not this year! From January on, this passage kept coming to mind because it described our situation so well:

Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into his harvest field." Matthew 9:35-38

There were crowds. When registration opened in mid-November, Family Camp 2 sold out in under an hour! Our other Family Camps were not far behind, and kid's camps were filling up faster than ever. 15 of our 26 sessions eventually sold out. When we waved goodbye to the last busload of teens, we had hosted 1,304 campers – our biggest year in two decades!

They were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. Unfortunately, this description is as true of people on Canada's West Coast today as it was 2,000 years ago. Kids are bullied and assaulted by destructive messages on social media. Many of our young campers have experienced deep hurt and loss. Depression and anxiety are rampant. There is a great need for people to experience compassion and to know they are loved and cared for unconditionally.

The harvest is plentiful but the workers are few. Building our Summer seemed tough. A strong job market and minimum wage increases make finding gualified volunteers a challenge, but this year was especially hard. At the beginning of staff training our staff team was very small. Could God supply volunteers in proportion to the record number of campers we would see?

Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into his harvest field. So ask we did! We prayed every day. And did God come through? Yes - but not in the way we expected! His provision was unique. A donor called to say "If transportation is a barrier, I'll cover flights - just get leaders to camp!" Session after session, our small core of dedicated volunteers was bolstered by individuals who came for 'just a week'. Many of their resumes didn't match the typical camp leader profile, but God's timing was always perfect! Yes - several past staff showed up with huge smiles and a ton of enthusiasm, but we had many more 'exceptions'! One family cancelled their holiday at Goldstream to help at the waterfront instead. A retired teacher stepped up to lead during Day Camp. A mom & daughter team did dishes for a week at Woodsman. During Session 8, every single LIT served as a Junior Leader! Rumour has it that even the General Director spent a week in a tent with nine 7-11 year old boys! (The last time I did that was 24 years ago: I've been missing out. What a great week! Thanks Adam Schafer for letting me be your LIT!).

So... What about the harvest? Did camp have an impact? This summer, 95 children told us that they made a first time commitment to follow Jesus. More than 300 others said that they grew closer to Jesus as a result of being at camp. A first time family camper said: "Honestly, I had no idea what to expect. We booked late and came with friends. Our kids had never camped before, so we didn't know. With that said, camp surpassed all of our expectations. Our kids were both crying yesterday because we had to leave camp today. Our family relaxed, had fun, made friends, learned... It was AMAZING!"

Yup. The workers were few. But what a great summer! I can hardly wait until next year!

## **Project Update**

Harbour House Update: By the time you read this, Joel & Kortni Loeve will have moved into our NEW staff house with

Lyleigh (9), and twins Enzo & Emmalea (2.5)! The house looks amazing, and we are incredibly thankful to *Cliff Stauffer* for taking the lead on this project. Other helpers are too numerous to list, but we would like to do a special shout out to **Quadrate Ventures** (Steve & Richard Swanson and their crew) for helping get us to occupancy. There is still work to complete (back deck and stairs, exterior cladding on east & south sides, entrance stairs and walkway, garage door, fencing, etc.), but we are sooo close! So far we have received cash gifts totalling \$177,606. Expenses to date are \$169,305. We anticipate remaining costs will be approximately \$18,000.



New Tents! The eight new canvas tents are FABULOUS! Many thanks to Ray Boyd for lending us his excavator and to Reign Scales (Intern, 2018-2019) for his good work to create a cluster of sites for the 5 upper tents. Fir decking was produced using our Wood-Mizer sawmill and installed by Joel Loeve and Haven Ullstrom. Clearbrook Iron Works donated 50 sets of custom bunk

**beds** which were assembled by a group of men from Campbell River. The beds are a real game changer! The girl's kept their tents tidy all summer, and the open floor space allowed leaders to gather their kids in a circle to discuss the messages and answer questions about Jesus. Progress was also made at Woodsman, where 3 tent platforms were rebuilt. This year we hope to complete this project by replacing the 5 lower tent platforms and tents and the remaining 3 platforms at Woodsman. If all goes according to plan, we will add two new tents and platforms to house LITs.

Washroom Upgrades: The transformation has begun! This spring we completed the first of 13 washroom renovations that are required around camp! The Guy's side of the Upper Washhouse was our first project, and the transformation was spectacular. The new standard will include low flow toilets to help us conserve water, stainless steel basins with metered taps, white FRP panelling on the walls for easy cleaning, and commercial grade flooring. Many thanks to Hadrian for donating enough stall dividers to re-do every washroom in camp! Upgrading our washrooms is consistently mentioned as one of our greatest needs when people are asked "How can we improve camp?" Donations towards this massive undertaking are needed.
