

PROJECT UPDATES:

Waterfront Redevelopment. Work continues on installing services to the dock. The main electrical cable has been strapped to the beams under the pier, and three stainless steel power pylons are ready to install. Running the last 500' of marine cable and water lines will get both systems functional. Funds are still required to purchase a drinking fountain, build an outhouse near the life jacket shack, as well as storage racks for canoes, kayaks, and SUP's. Pray that we will be able to find a donor to supply HDPE pipe floats so we can build low profile docks to help facilitate launching canoes & kayaks and easy access to the water for swimmers. We have almost 8,000 square feet of new docks in place, waiting for the kids to enjoy. Praise God for his incredible provision!

Kitchen Expansion. Our interim walk-in cooler & freezer are now functional! We are so grateful to *Fraser Valley Refrigeration* for their generous gift of new compressors, condensers, and evaporators. This quadruples our walk-in capacity! Our next step will be to remove the old cooler / freezer from the middle of the kitchen to increase our prep space. Construction drawings for the kitchen expansion have been completed. Pray for God's favour as we approach donors to fund a 1,600 square foot addition.

Katie's Cottage Renovation. Joel Loeve & Hunter Austring have completed the siding. Roger Friesen & Scott Loewen painted the interior and are installing v-groove pine on the ceiling. Next steps include flooring, cabinets, and trim. Praise God for skilled volunteers!









Rivendell Lodge Basement Bathrooms. Chris Contenti has roughed in the plumbing for two additional showers, and Joel Loeve has changed the framing to facilitate private change areas off each. Rivendell Lodge is typically booked 250 days a year, so these bathrooms have seen a LOT of use over the past 40 years. The upgrades will be appreciated by hundreds of guests and campers a year!

Domestic Water System. Many thanks to *Ken Embury* for helping Chris upgrade our water storage and distribution system. Re-plumbing the system will allow us to isolate storage tanks, monitor water levels, and add additional capacity as required in the future. If you've ever been at camp when we ran out of water, you will appreciate how important this project is! We wouldn't be able to do this work if not for COVID-19!

when overnight camping was cancelled. Now, thanks to a host of summer staff alumni, current and past staff and board, businesses, and dozens of friends of camp we are half way to reaching our goal of \$467,000 so we can make it to July 1, 2021.
