SAILING CAMP PACKING LIST

PARENTS

Make sure your camper brings all of the items listed below. Clothes should be able to take a lot of wear and tear. Please do not send clothing or other items that would cause grief if they are lost or damaged!

LOST & FOUND

Label all belongings with your first and last name. Lost & Found items will be kept for 3 weeks only. Found items will be returned if requested at your expense. Please email camp@camphomewood if an item is lost.

ESSENTIALS FOR SAILING CAMP

It is important to pack light. Please do not bring more than you need - you won't need a new pair of clothes each day. Each camper will be required to carry their gear on and off the boat and row to shore. Make sure that everything is packed in plastic bags inside your waterproof pack, duffel or tote so that everything stays dry!

Warm, thick jacket	Gloves

PLEASE NOTE:

Proper footwear is extremely important! The beaches are rugged with sharp rocks, shells, and barnacles. Campers **must** wear water shoes when walking from the row boat to the beach - these will get wet.

Fleece, wool, or dry-quick synthetic clothing is strongly recommended. Please pack rain gear!

PROVIDED BY HOMEWOOD

- Camping tent (4 person)
- Cooking equipement & utensils First Aid supplies
- Meals, snacks, and water
- Toilet paper, hand sanitizer
- PFDs / lifejackets

WHAT NOT TO BRING

- Tobacco, alcohol, marijuana, vapes, or illegal drugs (zero tolerance)
- Cell phones (can bring at own risk to use as a camera)
- Knives

Note: Cell phone use is not permitted while camp is in session (unless it's being used for photos or to check in with parents). Wifi is not provided to campers and cell service is very inconsistent. Please familiarize yourself with our Homesickness & Cell Phone Policies listed in the FAQ section of our website.

DRESS CODE

Just like schools and workplaces, Camp Homewood has a dress code that we ask all campers and staff to follow.

- No offensive slogans or profanity
- No short shorts, crop tops, or spaghetti strap tank tops
- Girls Swimwear: One piece, tankini, or rash guard and board shorts
- Boys Swimwear: Board shorts that fit (not too big, not too tight)
- Hats and sunglasses are strongly recommended when sailing

TUCK SHOP & THE HUT

An assortment of candy and chocolate is made available for campers from the hut on the first day. They will be able to choose all of their treats for the week and it will be labelled, placed in a large bag and be available on the boats only. Candy is not allowed to be brought ashore. The weekly limit is \$20 worth of treats.

The Hut, our clothing shop, will be open at our main site on the last day of camp. We sell t-shirts, hoodies, and stickers.
